INTELLIGENT FEED FORWARD: QUALIFYING ADDITIVELY-MANUFACTURED PARTS DURING THE BUILD PROCESS

Since the dawn of additive manufacturing, the idea that AM parts could be "born qualified" has excited researchers. A born-qualified part would be inspected and tested as it's being built—and when completed, be ready for use without further testing. LLNL and GE have partnered to reach this goal through in-process inspection and flaw mitigation. In this session, representatives describe their achievements to date and the anticipated influence of their findings on the commercial machines and manufacturing of the future.
